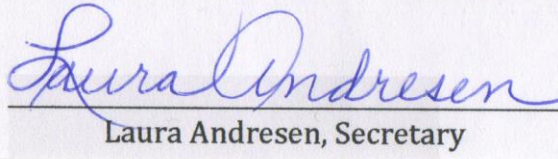

ACTIVITIES

Enrollment Increase Project:

- The real estate caravan's has generated a lot of positive press and several family calls. Nine new families and 13 new students have registered for next year. Two additional agents took a tour last week.
- Brochures and information was handed out at the Lilac Festival. The booth had a lot of traffic and I am hopeful we will gain some new registrations.
- We won the Lilac Festival parade for the category of "Walking," keeping our winning streak alive.
- Bumper sticker design Ideas have been voted on and our printer also designed a sticker. We are going to purchase 500 and give them out to families and board members and provide PMC clubhouse with some for their welcome packets for families.
- Wendy changed ad to be in color and include "tuition-free education" and to advertise after school program to increase interest level.

Staff:

- We have signed up for Google Suite so teachers have access to apps and features.
- Shanene Laudenberg is teaching sign language in all classrooms. She is working with the students to sign and sing "Wind Beneath Your Wings" for the end of the year program.
- Grace Phillips, Alene Litton and Amy Noall have all expressed their desire to return next year. Wendy and I will work together to develop contracts for them and have them signed before the end of the school year.
- We interviewed a possible teacher-aide candidate for Ann's classroom for next year, and we are interviewing another possibility tomorrow. I also have a lead for a 2 day aide in Alicia's classroom.
- We had a CPR Class May 5 and all teachers and all but one teacher aide and office aides are now certified.

Students:

- El Camino Pines went really well. Students were well behaved, engaged and inspired. It was an excellent science hands-on learning experience!
- Open House was Wednesday night and went well. We had one new TK student register!
- We had career day today. We had 4 people in careers from Engineer (JPL) to Screenwriters and Body Guard/Special Ops.
- Mrs. Brown from FHMS came to speak to the students Tuesday AM about HS life and to facilitate registration and math class placement. Tomorrow the Law Enforcement Academy and FFA are giving a presentation to students.
- May Life Skills were "Friendship and Sense of Humor" and June's is "Perseverance."
- End of the Year program is June 1. The play is "A Hero in Us All."

After School Program:

- Students are learning about costumes, set design and props. Shanene is coordinating with David Stenstrom to develop materials for the end of year play.
- Students developed a logo for the Bear Academy and students silk screened their own shirts last week. The cost of approximately \$150 is being covered through donations to the program from parents and community members.
- A group photo with students wearing their t-shirts will be taken next week for the yearbook.

CAASPP Testing:

- CAASPP Testing is almost complete. Students absent during testing will have until June 1 to finish-up. 5th grade and 8th grade students took the CAST (California Science Test) online, but Math and ELA utilized paper tests

Facility:

- We are ordering Port a Potties for the End of the Year Program.
- Pat Kearny evaluated the roofs/leaking problems of the Hummingbird and Quail classrooms and has provided a bid of \$3200 for repair, not replacement. If we approve his bid, he said he would have repairs complete before August.
- A new basketball hoop was donated by Anthony and Jenifer Ziegler of Your House On The Hill/Jennings Realty.
